Melba Marie Keehner (nee Stitzel) 94, of West Chester, Ohio, passed peacefully at her home, Monday, November 26, 2018. Born the youngest of nine children on October 18, 1924, in Hamilton, Ohio, to the late Clyde and Emma (Miller) Stitzel. She was raised in Reily Township, was a cheerleader, and graduated from Reily High School in 1942. She married her soulmate, Edouard Lee Keehner, September 18, 1948, at Millville Presbyterian Federated Church. She was employed with Ohio Farm Bureau. She was a Sunday School and Vacation Bible School Teacher, served on The Luther League, The Youth Group and The Church Council Committees. Melba served as president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer for L.C.W. Since 1979, she was an active member of Zion Lutheran Church in Hamilton, Ohio. She lived a fun-filled life traveling extensively around the world and being a part-time winter resident for 25 years in Tavares, Florida, where she enjoyed golf and card games, entertained, and attended Union Congregational Church. An amazingly strong woman in character and faith with a beautiful smile and a jovial demeanor exemplifies Melba. Because of her friendly and outgoing personality, she accumulated a vast amount of friends and never knew a stranger.
