Dr. Randolph passed away on January 4, 2010 in his home after a long illness. Born November 15, 1920 in Sutton, WV son of the late Mary Juergens Randolph and Brady F. Brady practiced as a family physician in Morgantown, WV for 8 years retiring then to accept his Orthopedic Residency in 1955. He retired from private practice in 1990 and accepted an appointment as Associate Professor Orthopaedic Surgery, University of Cincinnati School of Medicine, retiring as Emeritus

Professor in 1998.
