August 30, 1940 - July 13, 2022

Charles Stephen Thompson, “Chuck” passed away at the age of 81 on July 13, 2022 at Hospice of Cincinnati in Hamilton, Ohio surrounded by family following a short illness. He was born on August 30, 1940 in Atlanta, Georgia to Harry and Miriam Thompson. He graduated from Kenmore High School in Akron, Ohio in 1959. He served in the United States Army Reserves and attended Kent State University, where he ran track and played football. He eventually graduated from Wright State University with a Bachelor’s Degree in Secondary Education and a Master’s Degree in Counseling. He spent most of his career as a history teacher at Graham High School and a guidance counselor at Graham South Elementary School in St. Paris, Ohio, retiring in 2006. He spent his retirement playing golf, enjoying wine, and traveling. He is survived by his partner, Mary Pat Essman, brother David Thompson (Jane), and children Wendy Schreiber (Larry), Amy Cherubini (Julie), and Stephen Thompson (Stephanie), grandchildren Skyler Schreiber, Kristeen Schreiber, Jack Schreiber, Taylor Medders, Gia Cherubini, Sadie Thompson, and Steele Thompson. He is preceded in death by his daughter Jill Thompson in 1983, grandson Beau Schreiber in 2013, and sister Patricia Ann McMaster (Melvin) in 2012.
