



## Dr. Stanley H. Miller

December 23, 1918 - March 4, 2018

Dr. Stanley H. Miller age 99, Hamilton, died Sunday, March 4, 2018 at Berkeley Square Retirement Center, Hamilton Ohio. Dr. Miller was born in 1918 in Cincinnati, Ohio to Abraham and Rose (Melamed) Miller. He graduated from Walnut Hills High School, Cincinnati, Ohio where he held letters in football and basketball. He continued lifelong activities in running, golf, tennis and swimming. Dr. Miller attended the University of Cincinnati, attaining a B.S. degree in 1941, and then the University of Cincinnati School of Medicine, attaining his medical degree in 1943. Dr. Miller was inducted into the US Army Air Corps in 1943 with the rank of 1st Lieutenant and served at various bases in various medical capacities during WWII and was honorably discharged from service in 1946 with the rank of Captain. Upon his return home, Dr. Miller established a private medical practice on High Street, Hamilton, Ohio. In 1956, Dr. Miller built an office at 6th & Heaton Streets and practiced medicine there until his retirement in 1985. While in practice, Dr. Miller was active in many professional and private organizations including Ohio State Medical Association, Staff of Ft. Hamilton Hospital, Mercy (North) Hospital, Chief of Medicine Ft. Hamilton and Mercy Hospitals, President, Vice President, Secretary of Butler County Medical Association, Boys Club, YMCA, Elks, and New London Hills Swim Club. In 1970 Dr. Miller moved from Hamilton to Camden, OH and in addition to his medical practice, established Miller Racing Enterprises, raising and racing thoroughbred horses. Upon retirement Dr. Miller moved to Sarasota, FL and resided there for 19 years,

before returning to reside at Berkeley Square Retirement Community in Hamilton in 2005. In June of 1943, Dr. Miller married his wife of 74 years, Sylvia (Greer). They had three sons, Steve (Linda) of Hurdle Mills, NC, Timothy (Joy) of Alexandria, VA, and Stanley Jr. (Kristin) of Hamilton. He is survived by his wife, children, and great grandchildren.
