Elizabeth Ann (Libby) Martin Turnbull age 87, died at Berkeley Healthcare, Hamilton, Ohio, on Saturday November 8, 2008. She was born in Columbus, Ohio, February 23, 1921, the daughter of the late Russell W. and Marie R. Martin. She was educated in the Columbus schools, a 1938 graduate of North High School, attended St. Mary of the Springs College for Women and graduated with a BA degree in English at The Ohio State University in 1943 where she was a member of Chi Omega Sorority. She completed further study at Miami and Xavier Universities. Libby married the late Robert J. Turnbull of Hamilton in Memphis, TN, October 14, 1943 and they moved to Hamilton in 1947. She was a founding member of The Metropolitan Woman's Club (formerly Hamilton Junior Woman's Club), member of Current Events Club, The Presbyterian Church, and Ft. Hamilton-Hughes Hospital Auxiliary. Libby was an avid volunteer at Ft. Hamilton and Westover Retirement Community for many years. A teacher of English and Student Council Moderator at Badin High School from 1967-1976, Libby remained a strong supporter of that school and her former students.
