Frederick Kennen Randolph, passed away on February 4, 2013, at Dunedin, Florida at the age of 92, but was a long time resident of Butler County, Ohio. Mr. Randolph was predeceased by his first wife, Betty Jane (Kirgan) Randolph. He is survived by his second wife, Suzanne Christopher Randolph, his daughter, Sarah Nancy (Kirgan) Randolph, his step daughter, Jessica Smith and step grandchildren, Anna Re Neé and Jeffrey Matthew Smith. Mr. Randolph was a graduate of Hamilton High School and did his undergraduate studies at Miami University and the University of Chicago. He received a Bachelor of Laws Degree with Order of the Coif from the University of Cincinnati, College of Law in 1948. Mr. Randolph served as administrative assistant to Congressman Paul F. Schenck and served for many years as referee in the Butler County Common Pleas Court. He also served as acting City Prosecutor and Municipal Court Judge and was the Solicitor for the Village, now City of Trenton. As a Navy Veteran, he spent 30 months over seas and took part in the invasion of Iwo Jima in 1945 and later served as legal officer for the Air Force Reserve with the rank of Captain. Mr. Randolph also enjoyed an extensive law practice, specializing in the field of Real Estate Law and pioneered title insurance in the greater Butler County, Ohio area. He was licensed to practice in all Ohio and Federal Courts, including the United States Supreme Court. Mr. Randolph was a talented artist, and an accomplished musician, having played for the Cincinnati Pops Orchestra. In addition, he authored a number of legal articles and short fiction stories for

national publication. In addition, Mr. Randolph generously donated the funds to erect the bells located on the Old Butler County Court House Building.
