Harry Benjamin ZORNOW, Age 77, of Fairfield, died Thursday, August 25, 2005 at his home. He was born in Columbus, Ohio on August 9, 1928 the son of Harry B. and Gladys M. (Bogle) Zornow and moved to Hamilton at the age of six months.
