Jayne Seymour Horne, Hamilton, OH - Jayne Seymour Horne, 81, passed away peacefully on March 4, 2022, in Hamilton, Ohio. Jayne was born on September 5, 1940 in Langdon, North Dakota, to Phyllis Dennison Seymour and Daniel Joseph Seymour. She grew up in Cavalier, North Dakota and after graduating from high school, received a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from the University of North Dakota. She was commissioned as a Lieutenant in the U.S. Air Force, serving as a nurse at Lackland Air Force Base. While in San Antonio, Jayne met Laurence Horne. They married in 1965 and moved to Michigan, where they spent 40 years raising their daughters and creating friendships that would last a lifetime. Jayne enjoyed supporting her children's activities and pursuits in school, church, sports, and community activities. In 1984, she returned to nursing, working for 14 years in the adolescent psychiatric unit at St. Joseph Hospital in Pontiac, Michigan. Jayne and Larry retired to Keowee Key, South Carolina in 1998, enjoying their golden years in "Paradise". They moved to Hamilton, Ohio in 2017, to be close to their beloved grandsons Benjamin and Luke. This allowed "Nanu" to be their number one cheerleader at baseball and hockey games. Jayne's dynamic personality made her memorable to everyone she met. Her spirit, energy, and unique sense of humor was contagious. She never met a stranger and made meaningful friendships in every stage of her life. She always had time to listen but was never short on words, often dispensing opinions and advice. Jayne loved golf, reading, gardening, and bunnies (oh, so many bunnies!)

In addition to her parents, Jayne was preceded in death by her sister, Danielle Olesky, and niece, Dana Olesky. Jayne is survived by her husband of 56 years, Laurence Horne; daughters, Andrea Denton (David) of Charlottesville, VA, Heather McGlennen (Norman) of Ann Arbor, MI, Elizabeth Fiehrer (Todd) of Liberty Township, OH, and grandsons Benjamin and Luke Fiehrer. She also leaves behind brothers Thomas Seymour (Anita) and Bradley Seymour (Shaun); nieces and nephews Kim Olesky, Dara Lifson, Jenny Seymour, Daniel Seymour, Beth Ross, and Alaina Ghetti, and numerous friends so close they were considered family.
