Graduating from West Waterloo high school in 1945, where she played clarinet in the high school marching band, she entered McPherson College in McPherson, Kansas where she graduated in 1949. She then earned her Masters Degree in Library Science at Kent State University in Kent, Ohio. She joined the Public Library of Fort Wayne and Allen County in New Haven, IN where her responsibilities included school librarian service. Marlyn Miller was married January 15, 1955 to R. E. Anderson in Fort Wayne, Indiana. They moved to Schenectady, NY where her husband was associated with the General Electric Research Laboratory.

Marlyn's daughter, Linda, was born in 1960. Six years later, Marlyn moved to Strafford PA, giving birth to her second child, Roger Phillip in 1964. There she served as a Girl Scout leader and was active in various volunteer organizations. In 1976, the family moved to West Chester, Ohio. After raising both children, Marlyn returned to her career, working as a Reference Librarian in the Lane Public Library for a dozen years. In her retirement Marlyn acted as Research Director for the Anderson family trusts with a strong interest in market trends and U.S. employment, she participated in AAll meetings and enjoyed international travel, word puzzles, as well as gourmet cooking.
