Bob Fox, age 91, Hamilton, died Wednesday morning February 29, 2012. Bob was born in Hamilton on January 21, 1921, the son of George L. and Mary T. (Furst) Fox and was a 1939 graduate of Hamilton Catholic High School. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1941 to 1945 as a Seabee in the Pacific Theatre during WWII. On September 30, 1944, he married Dorothy Jewett, who preceded him in death December 24, 2005. After WWII he owned and operated The Tower Dairy Bar at High and Hancock in Hamilton for five years. He was a supervisor for Beech Nut for 24 years and worked in sales with Sell, Inc., Columbus, until his retirement. He was a member of the Cincinnati and Columbus Grocery Manufacturers Association and was a volunteer at Berkeley Square. Bob enjoyed participating in various sports growing up in Hamilton and in later years golf was his game. Most recently he continued to pursue his love of sports by following professional and college teams. Above all his favorite passion was spending time talking with his granddaughter, Melissa. Bob is survived by his son, Robert E. Fox, Jr. (Linda), Germantown and his daughter, Susan Brown (Larry), Westfield, Indiana and his granddaughter, Melissa Brown, sister-in-laws Esther Fox, Fairfield and Mary Humbach, Hamilton, Charles Lynn Jewett, California, favorite cousin Dick Zihlman, and several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his two brothers, George and Edward Fox. Funeral services will be held Monday, March 5, 2012 at 11:00 am at the Weigel Funeral Home, 980 N.W. until time of services. Burial will follow at Greenwood Cemetery.
