Mr. Ryan B. Hall, age 96, of Berkeley Square, Hamilton died March 18, 2010 at his residence. He was the son of Wallace and Maybelle Hall, both deceased and the widower of Mary Helen Hall. He graduated from Arsenal Technical High School (Indianapolis, Indiana) and attended DePauw University and graduated from Indiana University in 1935. A member of Delta Kappa Epsilon fraternity, he was Sports Editor of the Indiana University Daily Student and participated in dramatics. Mr. Hall's career was in association work and public affairs, retiring from The Hamilton Association of Trade and Industry, as its Executive Director, in 1978. He had various business and civic affiliations, serving as a President of the Hamilton and State of Ohio Chambers of Commerce. He also served on the Hamilton Board of Education; past president, Trustee of Fort Hamilton Hospital; past president of the Board of Trustees of The Presbyterian Church; and past President of the Berkeley Resident's Council. He was active in the Hamilton Rotary Club where he was a past President and was the creator and co-founder of Rotary Revels. He is survived by two daughters, Ann Foley and husband, Ralph of Martinsville, Indiana and Cathie London and husband, Jeff of Pace, Florida. He is also survived by five grandsons, David Ryan Foley and wife, Nancy, Brian Foley and wife, Melanie, Pete Foley and wife, Jill, Stephen Mayes and wife, Jill and John Mayes and wife, Vanessa as well as ten great grandchildren, all of whom were his delight and much beloved by him.
